Treasurers Report

Women in Business and Regional Development is run by a small board of women in business with the assistance of an Executive Officer. Over the past financial year we have continued to improve our processes and dedicated time to strengthen our strategic plan.

Our financial position over the past year has been stable with strategies put in place to increase our sponsorship and membership numbers for 2015-2016 financial year. The incredible success of the 2015 Influential Women in Business Awards and the commitment and passion of the existing board members has already enabled us to secure sponsorship from businesses who declined last financial year, so this is very promising. Our proposed budget for 2015-2016 looks stable and healthy and it is projected that we will have a surplus at the end of the 2015-2016 financial year.

In the absence of any funding or grants in FY2015, the reliance on memberships and sponsorships is crucial to the future and sustainability of Women in Business & Regional Development, however, we are always seeking out funding for our organisation.

WIBRD seek to achieve a balance between its vision of inclusiveness, administration costs and affordability for members.


The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity and that this special purpose financial report should be prepared on a cash basis.

Executive Officer Report

This financial year has seen three changes of Executive Officer, Diana Lloyd left in September for a family transfer and new job in Melbourne. Diana was sadly missed as we worked closely together organizing all events. Ros Taylor became our next Executive Officer and worked tirelessly to help promote and ensure our events were successful, however she resigned due to her expanding business pressures.

After a brief gap with no EO, I was then appointed to the role of Executive Officer in February 2015. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Diana and Ros and for their contribution to the network.

Membership & Sponsorship

As a not for profit organisation, we are constantly looking to build our membership & sponsorship base to ensure a sustainable and relevant organisation for the benefit of our members.

The strength of Women in Business is our valuable members and sponsors. This gives us the ability to empower all women though training, networking and supporting professional women including small business owners, career professionals, up and coming business women and entrepreneurs.

Throughout the year we have made a concerted effort to ensure all sponsors and members have received value for the money they have invested in the network. This effort is part of the strategic focus of increasing member and sponsor interactivity with the network and thus increasing future memberships and sponsorships.

For the 2015 calendar year we have had 53 Individual Members, 12 Corporate Members and 28 sponsors with varying sponsorship types. These sponsorships and memberships which we rely so heavily on, enable us to operate at a sustainable level.

Social Media & Online Platforms

With the ever changing world of business and its interactivity with technology, we have made a concerted effort this year to expand our utilisation of online platforms to communicate with our network obtaining fantastic results.

Our online newsletters have over 600 subscribers and helps to deliver key messages to the wider community that relate to women. A clear social media strategy was introduced to increase our exposure across the region. We have now achieved over 1170 Facebook 'Likes' up from 574 in December 2014. Twitter has over 400 followers and growing each week and LinkedIn EO has over 140 connections.

These platforms have become a fundamental part of our communications with our network, from event organisation to member engagement regarding the community. They have also changed the way in which the organisation operates on a day to day basis with a heavy reliance on our website and emails, which have enabled us to keep in regular contact with our valued sponsors and networks.

Moving Forward

Towards the latter part of the financial year, we have conducted a strategic analysis and review of the organisation to clarify where we are, what we are aiming to achieve and how we can go about achieving these objectives. This has resulted in an action plan being implemented to ensure a spread of roles across the board, structured training and events that focus on professional and personal development and a clear and united vision of where we are heading.

Over the past year there has been a change in momentum for Women in Business & Regional Development, with a dramatic increase in the number of attendees for our events, widespread media coverage and awareness in the community of what the organisation is endeavouring to achieve.

Events Report

It has been a busy year for WiBRD in 2014/2015. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the Events Committee, Sally Beck & Tahlia Gabrielli, who came on board in October 2014. Sally has recently resigned for a much more important role of caring for her new daughter Chloe and we wish her and Jimmy well.

As a Board we plan events based on our strategic plan and business plan and on feedback from surveys of our members and anecdotal responses provided from our members. Our mission is to enhance business connections, build skills base, develop friendships and support strategic alliances so we base our events on these ideals.

The member feedback has been that different timeslots and events appeal to different members based on their family/work life priorities. With this in mind, we have run our breakfast series to respond to networking and information sessions early in the morning. We have run several training sessions on Corporate Governance and Toastmaster Training. Also, we have held evening events, which are more focused on having fun at different venues but still being informative over an evening meal.
